Exhortation

THE PRESENT AND THE FUTURE KINGDOM

Jesus began his ministry by announcing in Mark 1:14-15 that the time had come and the kingdom of God was at hand. This must mean that some great event was about to take place.

In Matthew 12:28 and Luke 11:20, Jesus repeats his claim that the kingdom has come and evidences this by casting out demons. This authority over evil spirits shows both that the kingdom of heaven has broken into the rule of the evil one, and also that the true king rules more effectively.

When Jesus sent the 72 disciples out to preach, in Luke 10:1-20, they announced the arrival of the kingdom: as a result, "Satan fell like lightning from heaven". All Jesus' miraculous activity proves that the kingdom has come.

When John the Baptist began to doubt whether Jesus was the One he had been sent to announce, he sent his disciples to search out the answer. Matthew 11:2-5 & Luke 7:18-23 describes what convinced them that Jesus was the One who was ushering in the kingdom.

Jesus not only promised miracles in the future and forgiveness at the day of judgement, he also offered them both in the present – through himself. The kingdom came in and with Jesus. As the long-expected Messiah, Jesus is

central to everything the Gospels announce about the kingdom, and the kingdom is central to everything Jesus teaches.

In teaching that the kingdom had arrived, had come, had begun, was among people and was a present reality, Jesus also taught – in Matthew 11:11-12; Luke 7:28 & 16:16 – that some violence was associated with the arrival of the kingdom.

This does not mean that the kingdom was being established by physical violence. Rather, Jesus was pointing out the hostility of the world to the kingdom. John had already suffered and been imprisoned, and Jesus was warning those who would accept his rule that they must expect hostility – not just in the future, but also in the present.

THE FUTURE KINGDOM

As well as teaching that the kingdom had come, Jesus also taught that the kingdom was "not yet'. For example, in Matthew 5:1-10, many of the kingdom benefits are set in the future. Although 'the blessed' already possess the kingdom, there is something still to come in the future – comfort, inheritance, mercy and so on.

Jesus' prayer in Matthew 6:10 is also both present and future. If the kingdom had fully come, we would not need to pray for it to come.

In Matthew 7:21-22, Jesus refers to a future day of reckoning when he is speaking about entering the kingdom. It is much the same in Matthew 8:11 & Luke 13:28-29.

Throughout Jesus' ministry, he looked forward to a day when the kingdom would come. We can see this in Matthew 13:42-43; 16:27-28; 20:21; 26:29; Mark 9:1; 10:37; 14:25 & Luke 22:18.

As we study and examine God's rule, we must always keep these two elements in mind. The kingdom is both "now' and "not yet'. We can experience God's rule now but we also look forward to knowing it in the future. There is much for us now, but there is more still to come.

This means that we should work to establish God's kingdom now, yet we should work knowing that the kingdom will not be fully established until some future date.

Too many believers focus on either the present or the future. Some are pre-occupied with serving God on earth, yet lack the hope and joy which comes from looking to the coming kingdom. Others are so pre-occupied with 'the last day' that they do not establish the kingdom around them on earth. A true understanding and application of the kingdom embraces both the present and the future – as Christ did.

Each month we will look at questions you as a young person, or your friends might ask.



Question:

Why should I believe in God?

Answer:

I have a neighbour near where I live. He has everything, or so it seems! He has four cars, a boat, a wife, a good job, two daughters with well paid jobs abroad, each has a rich boyfriend. He's in good health and is well off. So why does he need God? You may be asking the same question!

There are three things to think about... First of all, you were built by God to be in a friendship with him - everyone has a 'God shaped hole' in their heart whether they believe it or not! (See the Bible, Ecclesiastes 3.11). Second, God offers everyone the opportunity to live with him forever in heaven - a place so incredible that words cannot describe it. It is a place where there will be no wrong, no death, no evil, no crying, no fear, no disease - only what is incredible, good and awesome (see Revelation chapter 21). Thirdly, God promised that he would give you life to the fullness in this world (see the Bible John chapter 10 verse 10).

There are many voices around us today in the world that will try and convince you that God is not real. But they cannot prove this. Science cannot disprove God, nor can man's thinking or things like archaeology (the study of ancient things found). In fact nearly every genuine archaeological thing found in places like Israel and the Middle East prove the existence of God - as evidenced by the words and findings of many people who don't believe in God, but aren't people who deliberately choose to reject God.

The Bible tells us that God has revealed himself to us in the Bible, in the creation around us which is beyond anything that mere chance could have

created. The 'chance' of the world having been formed 'accidentally' is way, way beyond what scientists technically call 'impossible'. There is no chance the world could have been created accidentally! God also has millions of people around the world who follow him and who live incredibly selfless lives to love and help others of all faiths, beliefs, colours and nations. These people are called 'the church' and it is the biggest investor in people, the greatest resource on earth and the biggest 'organisation' committed to seeing people's lives be transformed for good.

The Bible also tells us that God has put a conscience into mankind and breathed his breath into us. We are unique and are not animals! So God has done many things that show he's real. The Bible also has many prophecies (things people wrote down hundreds and thousands of years before) that have come true. The Bible has around 300 of these prophecies that were accurately fulfilled by Jesus (the fact that he would be born to a virgin - Mary; that he would be crucified; that he would have his bones broken; that men would gamble for his clothes; that he would rise from the dead; that he would go up into heaven; that he would be 'sold' for 30 pieces of silver and many more). The 'chance' of that happening is impossible too! But there are hundreds of other prophecies that have also happened. People go to fortune tellers, read their 'stars' in the paper and 'touch wood' but none of these mean anything.

Only the Bible is always true and the Bible is God's Written Word - it's his love letter (or his way of revealing who he is) to us. He is our Father, we are his children. He loves you so much he's even prepared to give you complete free choice to accept him or reject him. No other 'religion' is anything like this. Religion always makes you do, say and think things - even the world around us makes people think certain ways. But God gives you freedom and today he's calling out to you. Before I became a Christian, my life was full of 'stuff' but had no meaning. It is only with Jesus that my life has become really worthwhile.

Ask yourself - is this life all there really is?

PROPOSED CAP DEBT CENTRE, GROVE PARK



Goal and Aim – Serving the Lewisham Borough, helping people out of debt and poverty

Every 20 minutes and 15 seconds, a property is repossessed. Today, there are people in our communities whose lives are being devastated as a result of debt. They may be struggling to feed their families, suicidal, depressed and alone. People in our communities who are skipping meals so

their kids can eat and are on the verge of being evicted. CAP's service is changing thousands of lives like this every year.

Christians Against Poverty (CAP) is a national organisation specialising in <u>debt counselling</u> for people in financial difficulty, including those in need of bankruptcy or insolvency. It also provides Job Clubs for those seeking employment and Release Groups for people looking to overcome addictions and dependencies. In December 2011 CAP were granted their own Group Licence by the Office of Fair Trading alongside other leading debt counselling bodies, such as CAB and Advice UK

The organisation, a charity, works through a network of CAP Debt Centres all around the country that exist in partnership with a local Christian church. Individuals seeking the assistance of the charity give authority to the charity to negotiate with creditors, and the charity will then organise the individual's finances with the objective of making them debt free within 5 years. The caseworker will create a sustainable personal budget for clients, prioritising basic living needs and offering creditors fair, affordable pro-rata payments as far as this is possible. This service is offered at no cost to the individual.

Through the work of CAP Debt Centres many around the country have been delivered from the tyranny of debt and most importantly come to a personal relationship with Jesus as Lord and Saviour.

We plan to open a new CAP Debt Centre based in Rehoboth Building Grove Park to serve the Lewisham Borough community. Opening a new CAP Debt Centre incurs a significant cost including a minimum monthly donation of £600 towards the cost of the CAP centre, as well as the cost of hiring a CAP Debt Centre Manager - £8,000 to £10,000 per annum.

We believe God is leading us to do this and ask as a church that you please <u>PRAY</u> in faith to see this vision materialise. Thank you as you do so.
