Welcome & Consolidation Room

The room to your right when entering the building through the main doors, is a welcome room for new visitors, and consolidation for those who give their lives to the Lord in our services and / or at events.

Missions Fund

Thank you for your giving towards missions following the Mission Sunday. A total of \pounds 145 has come in so far.

This has now been sent to help with the Elim Relief Appeal for South Eastern Africa, following the devastation by Cyclone Idai, in which torrential rain and winds up to 170km/h swept from Malawi, across Mozambique and into Zimbabwe.

UN officials have stated that as at 17/03/2019, 150 have died, hundreds were missing. It was estimated that 1.5 million people have been affected in Mozambique (600,000) and Malawi (900,000).

Jackie Griffiths, the Elim missionary in Malawi, has said: "82,725 people have been displaced with many camping out in schools or one of the 187 camps that have been set up in all 14 of the affected districts... Many of our Elim members have been affected as well as church buildings damaged or destroyed. As well as loss of life or injury due to falling buildings and damage or destruction of buildings, crops which were just a few weeks away from harvest, have been totally destroyed. This is going to have a long-lasting effect."



Luke 23: 44 - 46

⁴⁴ Now it was about the sixth hour, and there was darkness over all the earth until the ninth hour. ⁴⁵ Then the sun was darkened, and the veil of the temple was torn in two. ⁴⁶ And when Jesus had cried out with a loud voice, He said, "Father, 'into Your hands I commit My spirit.' "Having said this, He breathed His last.



THE VEIL IS TORN

MARK 15:37-39

37 And Jesus cried out with a loud voice, and breathed His last. 38 Then the veil of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. 39 So when the centurion, who stood opposite Him, saw that He cried out like this and breathed His last, he said, "Truly this Man was the Son of God!"

King Solomon had built the first temple and after Israel was raided and the temple destroyed Herod built the second temple. The temple had three chambers, the outer court, the Holy place and the Holy of Holies. It is said that Herod's Temple was built to the dimensions of Solomon's Temple.

Hebrews 9:2-8

2 For a tabernacle was prepared: the first part, in which was the lampstand, the table, and the showbread, which is called the sanctuary; 3 and behind the second veil, the part of the tabernacle which is called the Holiest of All, 4 which had the golden censer and the ark of the covenant overlaid on all sides with gold, in which were the golden pot that had the manna, Aaron's rod that budded, and the tablets of the covenant; 5 and above it were the cherubim of glory overshadowing the mercy seat. Of these things we cannot now speak in detail. 6 Now when these things had been thus prepared, the priests always went into the first part of the tabernacle, performing the services. 7 But into the second part the high priest went alone once a year, not without blood, which he offered for himself and for the people's sins committed in ignorance; 8 the Holy Spirit indicating this, that the way into the Holiest of All was not yet made manifest while the first tabernacle was still standing.

The temple was the resting place of God in the physical world during the time of the Israelites sojourning on this earth. His dwelling place which was the Holy of Holies was separated from the rest of the temple by a massive curtain called the veil. The veil was said to be 60 feet high. The curtain separated a Holy God from sinful man. This curtain was the symbol of separation from the creator of the universe.

Adam and Eve created a veil when they turned away from a Holy God by sinning against God. From that time on a barrier was built between God and man. Man had no more one to one access to God except through chosen individuals through whom God will speak to man. Every year it was only the high priest that had access into the Holy of Holies where God presence dwelt behind the veil in a cloud.

However, 2000 years ago when God's only begotten Son Jesus laid down His life at Calvary, He restored that relationship between God and Man. Our Saviour Jesus Christ had to die the most gruesome of death, so that man's sin can be paid for. The Bible tells us that on the cross when He cried out and gave up the ghost, the veil was torn from top to bottom, to reveal the Holy of Holies. Which for years had been hidden from man's view. No man could have torn the veil from top to bottom because the veil was about 60 feet in height and about 30 feet in width.

.....First Word continued...

God supernaturally tore the veil giving access for man to approach Him. No longer was man to approach God through a priest or through the blood of bulls and goats, but through the broken body and she blood of Jesus Christ our Lord and saviour, man received access. Access has now been made for man to approach God without fear but with confidence.

Hebrews 4:14-16

14 Seeing then that we have a great High Priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus the Son of God, let us hold fast our confession. 15 For we do not have a High Priest who cannot sympathize with our weaknesses, but was in all points tempted as we are, yet without sin. 16 Let us therefore come boldly to the throne of grace, that we may obtain mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

We now have access to approach God with boldness, because the veil has now been removed. That is what we celebrate at Easter. We don't need to come to God through anyone except in the name of Jesus because of the price He paid for us. Why not approach God today with great confidence.

The veil is torn. Alleluia!

THE GREATEST COMMANDMENT – TO LOVE (Part 2 – continued from last month) - By Folake Henshaw

The Second

The second of the greatest commandment is like the first. To love our neighbour as our self. This is about loving other people. Loving them with agape love, unconditional love. The Good Samaritan parable exemplifies how we are called to love others as our self.

Luke 10: 25 - 37

²⁵ And behold, a certain ^[a]lawyer stood up and tested Him, saying, "Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?"

²⁶ He said to him, "What is written in the law? What is your reading of it?"

²⁷ So he answered and said, "'You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your strength, and with all your mind,' and 'your neighbour as yourself."

²⁸ And He said to him, "You have answered rightly; do this and you will live."
 ²⁹ But he, wanting to justify himself, said to Jesus, "And who is my neighbour?"

³⁰ Then Jesus answered and said: "A certain *man* went down from Jerusalem to Jericho, and fell among ^b thieves, who stripped him of his clothing, wounded *him*, and departed, leaving *him* half dead. ³¹ Now by chance a certain priest came down that road. And when he saw him, he passed by on the other side. ³² Likewise a Levite, when he arrived at the place, came and looked, and passed by on the other side. ³³ But a certain Samaritan, as he journeyed, came where he was. And when he saw him, he had compassion. ³⁴ So he went to *him* and bandaged his wounds, pouring on oil and wine; and he set him on his own animal, brought him to an inn, and took care of him. ³⁵ On the next day, ^[C]when he departed, he took out two denarii, gave *them* to the innkeeper, and said to him, 'Take care of him; and whatever more you spend, when I come again, I will repay you.' ³⁶ So which of these three do you think was neighbour to him who fell among the thieves?"

³⁷ And he said, "He who showed mercy on him."

Then Jesus said to him, "Go and do likewise."

How do we express or live out this love for our neighbour based on this parable?

- 1. Being compassionate and showing compassion
- 2. Being patient and kind
- 3. Helping others in time of their need
- 4. Freely you have received, freely give. Being generous
- 5. Caring for others
- 6. Seeking the good and well-being of others

We also express love for others through forgiveness

Luke 15: 11 – 22

¹¹ Then He said: "A certain man had two sons. ¹² And the younger of them said to *his* father, 'Father, give me the portion of goods that falls *to me*.' So he divided to them *his* livelihood. ¹³ And not many days after, the younger son gathered all together, journeyed to a far country, and there wasted his possessions with ^[d] prodigal living. ¹⁴ But when he had spent all, there arose a severe famine in that land, and he began to be in want. ¹⁵ Then he went and joined himself to a citizen of that country, and he sent him into his fields to feed swine. ¹⁶ And he would gladly have filled his stomach with the ^[e] pods that the swine ate, and no one gave him *anything*.

¹⁷ "But when he came to himself, he said, 'How many of my father's hired servants have bread enough and to spare, and I perish with hunger! ¹⁸ I will arise and go to my father, and will say to him, "Father, I have sinned against heaven and before you, ¹⁹ and I am no longer worthy to be called your son. Make me like one of your hired servants."

²⁰ "And he arose and came to his father. But when he was still a great way off, his father saw him and had compassion, and ran and fell on his neck and kissed him.
²¹ And the son said to him, 'Father, I have sinned against heaven and in your sight, and am no longer worthy to be called your son.'

²² "But the father said to his servants, ^(f) Bring out the best robe and put *it* on him, and put a ring on his hand and sandals on *his* feet. ²³ And bring the fatted calf here and kill *it*, and let us eat and be merry; ²⁴ for this my son was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found.' And they began to be merry.

1 Corinthians 13 shows us how to live at this love for others:

Though I speak with the tongues of men and of angels, but have not love, I have become sounding brass or a clanging cymbal. ² And though I have *the gift of* prophecy, and understand all mysteries and all knowledge, and though I have all faith, so that I could remove mountains, but have not love, I am nothing. ³ And though I bestow all my goods to feed *the poor*, and though I give my body ^[a]to be burned, but

have not love, it profits me nothing.

⁴ Love suffers long *and* is kind; love does not envy; love does not parade itself, is not ^bpuffed up; ⁵ does not behave rudely, does not seek its own, is not provoked, ^c thinks no evil; ⁶ does not rejoice in iniquity, but rejoices in the truth; ⁷ bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things, endures all things.

⁸ Love never fails. But whether *there are* prophecies, they will fail; whether *there are* tongues, they will cease; whether *there is* knowledge, it will vanish away. ⁹ For we know in part and we prophesy in part. ¹⁰ But when that which is ^[d]perfect has come, then that which is in part will be done away. ¹¹ When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child; but when I became a man, I put away childish things. ¹² For now we see in a mirror, dimly, but then face to face. Now I know in part, but then I shall know just as I also am known. ¹³ And now abide faith, hope, love, these three; but the greatest of these *is* love.

Again, only the Holy Spirit can help us to love others wholeheartedly and unreservedly like this. Ask for His help today and every day and He will help you as you as you submit to His leading and guidance.

Finally, God is love and he or she who loves is born of God, and belongs to God. The greatest and best thing you and I can do is to love.


...GOD LOVES YOU!....


