◆ Cell Groups

The Cell Ministry at Word of Life Church is at the "heart" of our Church Life. Our goal, & Jesus' command is to "make disciples". An important way we do this at Word of Life is through small connect groups, which we call cell groups. Led by a Christian believer, each group consists of anything between two & twelve people who meet in homes, cafes, in the church building, or wherever they choose.

The cell meetings constitute a time of praise & worship, and teachings where the Word of God is shared in a simple & practical way. A Bible study lesson is shared with real life applications, putting the story of the Bible into OUR world. The cell serves as a place of care & friendship, as well as an evangelistic mission that new people can be invited to & won to Christ. The ultimate goal of each group is to disciple its members & prepare them to go & disciple others.

Generally speaking, the cell enables a person to grow in his of her relationship with God through the knowledge of his Word, and in relationship with others in an intimate setting. The cell is where what happens in a church service happens in a miniature form, but with the added bonus of close friendships & relationships being built. Our Cells bring life. Our Cells reach out to the community. Our Cells are fun! Our Cells are about relationships.

Our Cell groups meet on a weekly basis. Cell members walk away from the meetings feeling encouraged, renewed & refreshed in their spirits. ◆ Hall for Hire

Rehoboth building is available for use at various times throughout the week & open to the community for multiple purposes. The Resource Centre (lower floor) is made up of a multi-function hall, as well as a kitchen/chill out room, a medium sized room & a large entrance/hallway. These can be used for seminars, workshops, training days, product launches, baby showers, private dinners, extra tuition classes, small events etc... The multi-function hall is suitable for a maximum of approximately 80 people with a cabaret style seating arrangement, 100 people with theatre style seating arrangement or 120 people standing.

The main hall in Rehoboth Building is also open for use to members of the community. It has a capacity of approximately 180 seats. However, its use is reserved exclusively for church services, including weddings, funerals or child dedication services.



John 4: 34—37 (NKJV) ³⁴ Jesus said to them, "My food is to do the will of Him who sent Me, and to finish His work. ³⁵ Do you not say, 'There are still four months and then comes the harvest'? .FIRST WORD ..

BEING A WITNESS DESPITE YOUR CHAINS

Acts 16:25-34

²⁵ Around midnight Paul and Silas were praying and singing hymns to God, and the other prisoners were listening. ²⁶ Suddenly, there was a massive earthquake, and the prison was shaken to its foundations. All the doors immediately flew open, and the chains of every prisoner fell off! ²⁷ The jailer woke up to see the prison doors wide open. He assumed the prisoners had escaped, so he drew his sword to kill himself. ²⁸ But Paul shouted to him, "Stop! Don't kill yourself! We are all here!"

²⁹ The jailer called for lights and ran to the dungeon and fell down trembling before Paul and Silas. ³⁰ Then he brought them out and asked, "Sirs, what must

do to be saved?"

³¹ They replied, "Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved, along with everyone in your household." ³² And they shared the word of the Lord with him and with all who lived in his household. ³³ Even at that hour of the night, the jailer cared for them and washed their wounds. Then he and everyone in his household were immediately baptized. ³⁴ He brought them into his house and set a meal before them, and he and his entire household rejoiced because they all believed in God.

Many times, some of us find it difficult to be a blessing during the times of our difficulties. For some people their circumstance determines whether they pray or praise God.

In this scripture we see Paul and Silas humiliated and persecuted for setting a young girl free from the bondage of divination. The bondage of a slavery to a false god. Paul and Silas were wrongly accused and locked up, chain and barrel. Yet in the middle of their imprisonment and predicament, they prayed and sang praises to God. Paul and Silas were able to pray and praise God because their joy was not conditioned by their situation.

In the direst situation and circumstance, you will find that God has provided you with sufficient grace and a song for the situation.

2 Corinthians 12:8-9 ⁸ Three different times I begged the Lord to take it away. ⁹ Each time he said, "My grace is all you need. My power works best in weakness." So now I am glad to boast about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ can work through me.

Paul and Silas realised that their prison experience was meant to bring God glory and in the midst of their predicament they chose to glorify God. Every day of our lives we come across people, individuals in chains and in prison. Most times just like Paul we are brought into their lives for a purpose and that purpose is for God to be glorified. When life becomes just about us, we fail to see what God is trying to do through us.

Jesus said in John 4:4 *He had to go through Samaria on the way.* Paul and Silas had to go through this prison in order to bring the jailer and his household to the Lord. The Bible says in prison, as they prayed and sang praises to God there was a massive earthquake and every one's hands were loosed. Paul and Silas' hands were loose, the prisoners' hands were loose. The Prison doors flung open because Paul and Silas refused to allow their own situation to dictate whether they will glorify God or not. This result helped to progress the gospel. The jailer asked one of the most important question any unbeliever would or should ask.

What must I do to be saved?

This gave Paul the opportunity to preach the gospel, which brought salvation to a whole household.

Does your circumstance dictate how you praise God?

Does your situation define your faith?

If we love God as much as we profess His love should compel us to preach the gospel in whatever situation we find ourselves. His love should bring us to that place of praising in Him in whatever situation we find ourselves. Then people will see and ask us about Him and we can boldly say to them like Paul and Silas did.

³¹ They replied, "Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved, along with everyone in your household." ³² And they shared the word of the Lord with him and with all who lived in his household.

Remember.

People still need to know Christ despite your chains.

People still need to know Christ despite the persecutions you go through.

People will come to know Christ as they see you glorify God in spite of your situation.

Pray and sing praises to God despite your situation. You never can tell whose life God wants to touch through you. Your situation and response to it might be the next message that will stir someone up to ask you that all important question: "Sirs, what must I do to be saved?"



.....GOD LOVES YOU..

God Loves YOU and wants you to have a relationship with Him through His son Jesus.

The Bible says that God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, Jesus, so that whoever believes in him shall not die, but have eternal life (John 3: 16).

The first step to know more of God is to obey His Word and receive Jesus as your Lord and Saviour, by simply repenting of your sins and believing that Jesus has died on the cross and paid the price for you to be reconciled to God for ever. By doing that, you will receive a new life, the very life of God, within you, and you will become a child of God. If you want to make that step, please see below. These will explain to you more about it. Don't put it off, God has been waiting for you... Today is the day! God bless you.

GOD's Purpose: Peace and life God loves you and wants you to experience peace and life: abundant and eternal.

"we have peace with GOD through our Lord JESUS CHRIST." (Romans 5:1)

"I have come that they may have life in abundance." (John 10:10)



"for GOD so loved the world that he gave his only begotten SON, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have everlasting life." (John 3:16)

Why don't most people have this peace and abundant life that God planned for us to have?

The Problem: Our Separation God created us in his own image to have an abundant life. He did not make us as robots to automatically love and obey him. God gave us a will and a freedom of choice. We chose to disobey God and go our own wilful way. We still make this choice today. This

Our attempts to reach GOD People have tried many ways to bridge this gap between themselves and God....

results in separation from God.

"there is a way that seems right to man, but in the end it leads to death." (Proverbs 14:12) "but your iniquities have separated you from your GOD; your sins have hidden his face from you, so that he will not hear." (Isaiah 59:2)

No bridge reaches GOD... except one...

GOD's Bridge: The Cross Jesus died on the cross and rose from the grave. He paid the penalty for our sin and bridged the gap between God and people.

for Christ died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, to bring GOD and men, that man you to GOD." (1 Peter 3:18)

"for there is one GOD and one mediator between JESUS CHRIST." (1 Timothy 2:5)

"but GOD demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, CHRIST died (Romans 5:8)



GOD has provided the only way. Each person must make a choice!
